Wellspring Counseling Statement of Faith

Wellspring Counseling is a non-denominational Christian counseling service. We exist to serve persons from any background or persuasion, religious or secular; however, our approach to therapy will be based upon an understanding of the nature, needs and purpose of human beings which is grounded in biblical revelation. We will also seek to integrate the best contributions of the psychological sciences to provide the highest quality care to our clients.

We affirm the following:

There exists only one God¹, Creator and Sustainer of all things², perfect in all of His attributes³, and existing eternally⁴ in three Persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit⁵. He is by His very nature unchangingly good, loving, true, wise and just⁶ to a degree possessed by no other.⁷

The Scriptures, both Old and New Testaments, are the inspired Word of God⁸, without error in the original manuscripts, and fully trustworthy in all they teach⁹. They are the complete revelation of His will for the salvation of human beings¹⁰, and the final authority for all matters on which they speak.¹¹

Human beings were created in God's image, male and female¹², as objects of His love¹³ and for His glory¹⁴. They were created morally and relationally perfect¹⁵. However, they chose to disobey God¹⁶, and thus brought upon themselves and their descendants guilt, alienation, suffering, and death¹⁷. This disobedience, or sin, does not put an end to God's love for His creatures¹⁸, but breaks their relationship with Him¹⁹ and seriously damages their ability to relate properly to one another, to the rest of creation, and even to themselves.²⁰

Jesus Christ is God's only solution to the problem of sin.²¹ He paid the penalty for sin on our behalf when He died on the cross²², and inaugurated new life when He physically rose from the dead.²³ This same life is given to all who trust Him alone for salvation²⁴; they are restored to a true and eternal relationship with God as His children²⁵, receive His forgiveness for all their sin²⁶, and are given a new nature which makes it possible to live as God intends²⁷. They are also assured of a future resurrection²⁸ at which time all of God's promised blessings to His children will be made complete²⁹, including complete freedom from sin and its effects, and they will live in His presence forever.³⁰

The Holy Spirit is God's agent of new life for believers in Jesus Christ³¹. He gives them assurance that they are indeed God's children³², guides them³³, comforts them³⁴, helps them to recognize and approve God's will, convicts them when they disobey, and enables them to live in ways that honor Christ and bring true fulfillment to themselves.³⁵

The Christian life is a process of becoming more and more like Christ in attitudes and actions³⁶. God's will is that every believer experience abundant life as they bring every area of their lives progressively into greater submission to His will, through the power of His Holy Spirit, and increasingly align their thoughts and emotions with the truth of His word.³⁷

Our ministry of counseling recognizes the complexity of people as physical, intellectual, emotional, social and spiritual beings. The ultimate goal of Christian counseling is to help others move towards personal wholeness, interpersonal competence, mental and emotional stability, and spiritual maturity.
